Accreditation-Provisional does not ensure any subsequent accreditation status. It is limited to no more than five years from

matriculation of the first class. Accreditation-Provisional remains in effect until the program achieves Accreditation-Continued after its third review, closes or withdraws from the accreditation process, or until accreditation is withdrawn for failure to comply with the *Standards*.
